Dear LGBT+ Conservatives.

We changed the law so that same-sex couples could get married, we cut the cost of obtaining Gender Recognition Certificates and we accepted the intent behind all of Lord Etherton's recommendations in his LGBT independent review.

But I know there is more to do. No one in our society should feel unsafe because of who they are. And, nobody should have to hide who they are or who they love. From my experience as Home Secretary, I know we need to do more to tackle crime targeted at the LGBT+ community and I know there is more work to do to make sure our Party's culture is truly inclusive and tolerant. We can have open and honest debates in good faith when exploring difficult issues, but we must make sure we always return to our principles on common ground.

I want to build a party proud of all its members and, ultimately, lead a government with equality of opportunity at its very heart. We have a bold and aspirational message to share with the country and it is only by working closely with organisations - such as your own - that we can ensure it reaches all corners of our United Kingdom.
